

Pediatric Immunologist - Asthma Chair Department of Paediatrics Cumming School of Medicine

The Department of Paediatrics (http://www.ucalgary.ca/paediatrics/), the Alberta Children's Hospital Research Institute (ACHRI; http://research4kids.ucalgary.ca) and the Snyder Institute for Chronic Disease (Snyder; http://www.snyder.ucalgary.ca/) invite applications for an appointment with Tenure at the level of Professor. The successful candidate will be appointed to the Chair in Pediatric Asthma.

Qualifications of the applicants include an MD, with specialty certification in Pediatrics and in Immunology/Allergy, with certification from the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada, or equivalent. A PhD would be considered an asset. Candidates are expected to present evidence of an established, externally funded research program, a strong publication record, a record of successful teaching and graduate student supervision, and evidence of established academic engagement and leadership contributions within the professional and other communities. Eligibility for medical licensure in the province of Alberta is required.

We are seeking an individual with expertise in pediatric immunology and a research program focused on child and youth asthma and with a strong track record in research and mentorship who can coordinate a vigorous research program exploring the early diagnosis, prevention, treatment or outcome of child and youth asthma. The successful candidate will be expected to coordinate an identifiable program of clinical care, education and research while fostering collaboration between other disciplines within the University of Calgary and Alberta Health Services. The Chair holder is expected to provide leadership in the development of a multidisciplinary and collaborative research program in child and youth asthma; support transfer of new knowledge into improvements in clinical practice and best practice policies; attract and mentor trainees and more junior faculty; and collaborate with key partners to achieve synergies around the broader children's mental health programs within the Calgary Zone.

The Chair in Pediatric Asthma is an endowed Chair within the Cumming School of Medicine. The chair holder will be appointed in the Section of Pediatric Hematology and Immunology, Department of Pediatrics, with a joint appointment in other Departments according to their interest and activities. The position provides at 70% protected time for research, and will include expectations to contribute to teaching. This is an excellent opportunity to develop an independent externally funded research program within a collaborative environment. Generous startup packages are available through the Institutes and CSM.
