



Academic Faculty Position, Pediatric Respiriology University of Manitoba/Shared Health, Winnipeg, Manitoba

The University of Manitoba and Shared Health in Winnipeg, Manitoba are inviting applicants to fill a full-time academic faculty position in the Section of Respiriology, Department of Pediatrics and Child Health, Max Rady Faculty of Medicine.

The University is located in the multi-cultural and vibrant city of Winnipeg, the province of Manitoba's primary research-intensive academic institution, and offers over 100 degree, diploma and certificate programs to more than 30,000 students from around the world.

The Department of Pediatrics and Child Health is comprised of more than 100 geographical full-time physicians representing all Pediatric Subspecialties, and includes 7 full time PhD Scientists and over 150 other affiliated Faculty and Medical Staff Members. The Department of Pediatrics & Child Health and the Shared Health Child Health Program collaborate closely with the Children's Hospital Research Institute of Manitoba to improve the health and care for children in the province.

The Section of Pediatric Respiriology is the referral centre for patients in Manitoba, Northwest Ontario and Nunavut. The Section of Pediatric Respiriology provides care to children with a wide variety of respiratory problems including, but not limited to, bronchial asthma, cystic fibrosis, sleep-related breathing disorders, and chronic respiratory insufficiency. The Section operates pediatric pulmonary function and sleep laboratories. In addition, the Section offers flexible bronchoscopy diagnostic service. The Section has one of the six Royal College accredited training programs in Pediatric Respiriology in Canada.

Candidates must have specialty qualifications in Pediatrics and Pediatric Respiriology in the country of current practice and must be eligible for specialty registration with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Manitoba. Certification in Pediatrics and Pediatric Respiriology by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada is preferred. The applicant will be expected to participate in the educational programs for undergraduate medical students and postgraduate residents. Demonstrated excellence in teaching is required and a commitment to collaborating with others in research and other scholarly endeavors is strongly encouraged. Evidence of a high standard of professionalism is essential.
